Fall Days are coming!

Also coming are some new Club happenings!

More kids will be able to attend the Club than ever before because of the new facilities that you have helped to build here. We anticipate about a 25% increase in daily attendance at the Club. That also means more possibilities for Club programming and efficiency.

- ◇ **The expanded entry** will markedly ease congestion when kids sign in for the day and when parents pick them up at the end of the day. No longer will you hear, "Excuse me! Coming through! Excuse me!" in a crowded hallway. People can wait comfortably, visit with each other, and greet their kids.
- ◇ **The large multipurpose room** will serve as a cafeteria primarily and double as space for large group activities, especially in the winter months.
 - * Meals and snacks will be served to hundreds of kids from the new kitchen. Imagine having a full-service kitchen after using crock pots and toaster ovens to serve meals and snacks daily. Our food service manager thinks he died and went to "kitchen heaven".
 - * Large group activities in the multi-purpose room will include dance lessons, movies for everyone, and Dance Dance Revolution. Especially when kids are kept inside because of the cold, this room gives the Club lots of fun possibilities.
- ◇ **The Performing Arts Center** will premier in a classroom on the south wing that has been used for storage over the last year. The Club will finally have a room dedicated to talent show and play practice, music lessons and band practice, dance, and other performing art activities.

CLUB TEENS



Teens went fishing for fish this summer, but this fall they will be fishing for other teens. **With the goal of increasing teen membership in the Club by 25%, the Club is planning the following:**

1. registration incentives, like "Bring a Friend, get a Pizza"
2. teen outreach activities, like a drawing for two \$50 gift certificates for all teens who sign up for the school year
3. a restructuring of teen spaces and activities, by dividing our current teen space in two, so that jr. high and high school youth each have a dedicated space of their own.

Among the activities being considered for the fall are a teen dance, a battle of the bands, swimming, and various service activities.
